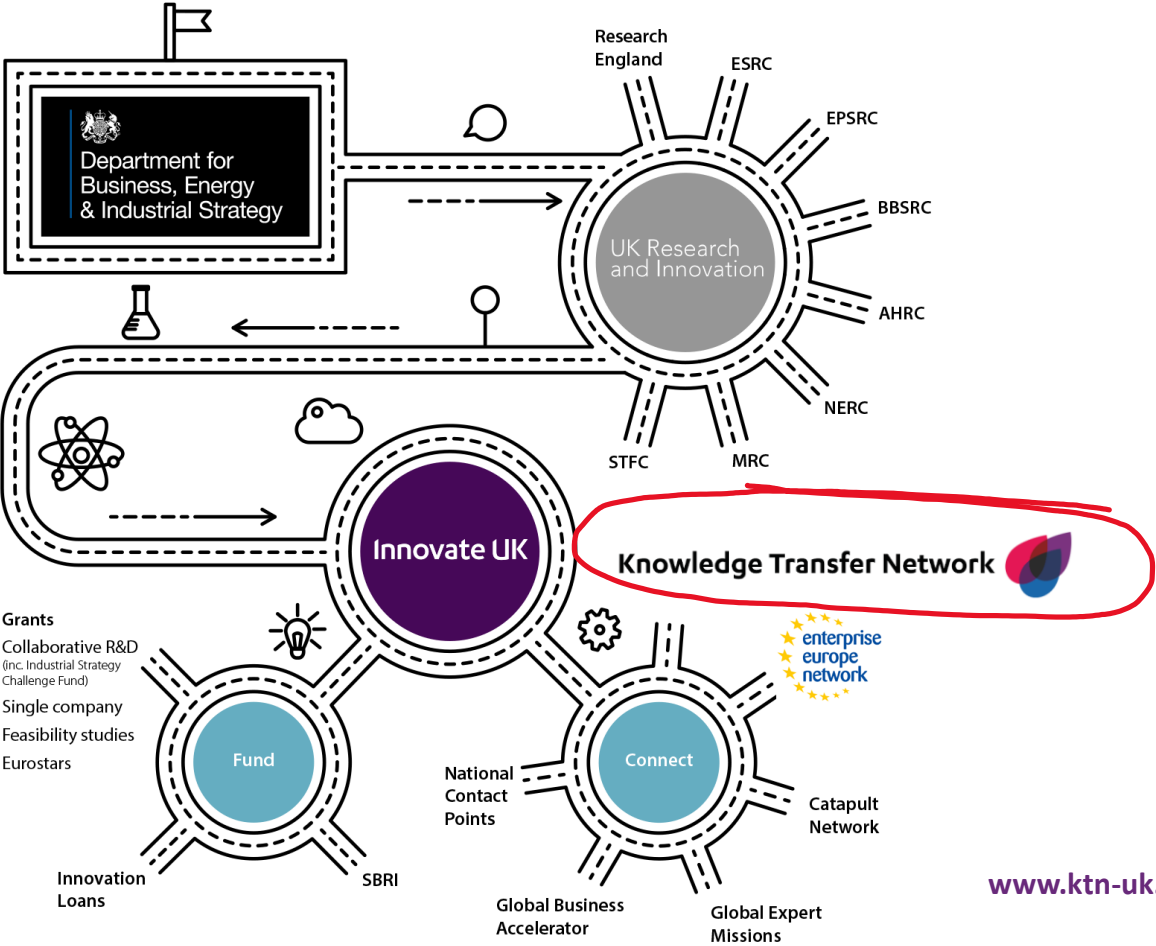




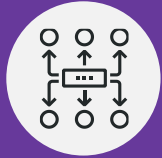

Innovate UK funding



SBRI: Monitor and visualise domestic pollution to safeguard health £100,000

Closes 15th April

The SBRI will fund organisations to develop and demonstrate new products and services. These must enable households to measure, visualise and respond to harmful household air pollution in order to safeguard health. **Any organisation can lead the project.**

The overall programme will be delivered in 2 phases.

- Phase 1 will focus on exploring the feasibility of proposals.
(£20,000 total project costs, 3 months duration)
- Phase 2 will concentrate on research, development and testing.
(£300,000 total project costs, 1 year duration)

This competition is to secure funding for phase 1 projects. Only successful phase 1 applicants will be eligible to apply for the phase 2 funding.

Energy Catalyst Round 8 £20m Opens June 2020, closes Sept 2020

The programme supports UK and overseas businesses and organisations to develop highly innovative, market-focused energy technologies that primarily look to enable energy access in Sub-Saharan Africa and South/South East Asia.

Projects must address the following challenges:

- energy trilemma based on 3 pillars – cost, emissions and security
- energy access
- gender equality and social inclusion

Energy Catalyst Round 8 £20m Opens June 2020, closes Sept 2020

There are three strands of funding available

- Early stage feasibility £300,000 (12months)
- Mid stage prototype development in country £1.5m (24 months)
- Late stage demonstration in country £5m (36 months)

All projects must have;

- an Administrative lead and Technical lead
- a UK organisation to be the Administrative lead (business for mid and late stage)
- A SME involved

International collaboration is encouraged. International partners will be funded through the UK Administrative lead

Energy Catalyst Round 8 International trips

The aim of these trips is to help organisations gain an understanding of the energy access issues in the country visited and for businesses to develop equitable partnerships between organisations interested in submitting an Energy Catalyst Application.

- Rwanda, 16th – 22nd May **closes 13th March**
- Togo, 7th – 12th June **closes 13th March**
- Ghana, 13th – 19th June **closes 20th March**
- Zambia, 11th – 17th June **closes 27th March**
- Malawi, 4th – 10th July **closes 27th March**

Other public funding



Global Challenges Research Fund GCRF £9.3m Closes 6th May 2020

The Fund will invest in processes, products and services which have the potential to transform lives in developing countries and meet one of the UNs 10 Sustainable Development Goals

- Phase 1 - Discovery: enabling businesses to gain insights into local market feasibility for the innovation prior to prototyping. (**max grant £60,000, 6 months duration**)
- Phase 2 - Prototype phase: to test, validate and improve a prototype of the innovation in a developing country market.

This competition is to secure funding for phase 1 projects. Only successful phase 1 applicants will be eligible to apply for the phase 2 funding.

Other public funding



Global Challenges Research Fund GCRF £9.3m Closes 6th May 2020

- All projects must have an Administrative lead and Technical lead
- UK businesses must be the Administrative lead
- Businesses, academics and public sector from any country can be the Technical lead
- International partners will be funded through the UK Administrative lead

UK businesses can work alone in Phase 1 but will need to collaborate in Phase 2. During phase 1, your project must involve work in the chosen developing country. This can be done by any partner in the project, but you must name the partner or partners in your application.
