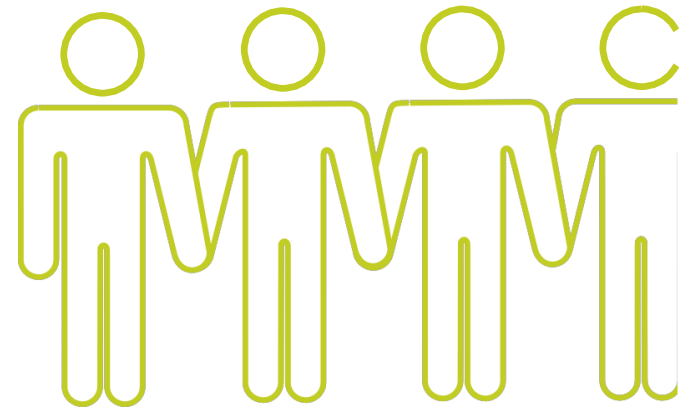

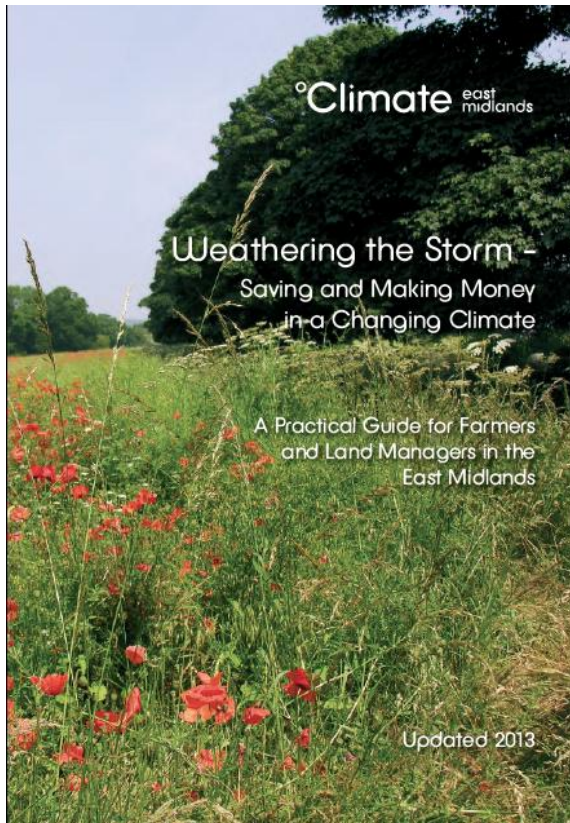


Why SWM?
